

HOME AWAY FROM HOME (THE HOSTEL)

Our college hostel which is a home away from home holds envious positions in the area. A holistic living ambience contributes to superior academic performance. Our Hostel enjoys reputation for providing healthy residential facilities to 125 students. The hostel is housed in a beautiful building fitted with modern amenities of life, electric fans, toilets and 24 hours running water & generator. Bathrooms are fitted with geysers to provide hot water in winter. There are also water coolers to provide cold drinking water in summer. The hostel has fully furnished and well ventilated rooms, a meditation room, a medical room, a spacious dining hall and a common room. In the common room, there is a provision of watching television and playing indoor games. A qualified medical officer visits the hostel from time to look after the health of the students.

A separate admission form has to be filled up for a seat in the hostel. Allotment of the rooms is done by the warden in consultation with the Principal. Students seeking admission to the hostel will have to abide by all the rules and regulations of the hostel, which have been given in the resident students' Handbook-cum-Record book.

PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

Application for admission must be made on prescribed admission form. The following documents along with attested copies must be produced at the time of registration:

- A. Good conduct certificate by the head of the institution last attended.
- B. Matriculation certificate showing date of birth.
- C. Certificate showing the last examination passed.
- D. University Registration card (if any)
- E. A certificate to the effect that the candidate was not disqualified by any Board or University.
- F. Migration certificate for the students from outside Panjab University, Chd.
- G. Reserved category Certificate.
- H. Affidavit justifying gap in studies (if any)
- I. Candidate's Aadhar Card & Bank Account Copy.

Candidate with a break in their studies will not ordinally be admitted unless the gap in studies is justified to the satisfaction of the admission committee.

The college reserves the right to refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason whatsoever or disallowing any combination of subjects in which the number of students is either small (Less than Ten) or causes dislocation in the time table.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- A. A student whose result of +2 examination conducted by a school board is published late may be admitted without late fee within 15 days of the declaration of the result.
- B. The students of P.U. Chandigarh who have appeared in any of its examination and the result is declared late for one reason or the other, the admission can not be said to be a case of fresh admission. They are already midway of the course. In their cases, admission to new class is allowed within 10 days from the date of communication of result, without charging any late fee. However their lectures will be counted when the classes commence in the college.
- C. A candidate seeking admission to B.A. I class should have obtained at least 33% marks in the aggregate including the subject of compartment (theory and practical taken together) in +2 class.
- D. In the case of foreign student, eligibility certificate must be obtained from university and be submitted at the time of admission.
- E. Student seeking admission on the basis of the qualification obtained from another university will have to produce Migration and Original lower examination passed certificate at the time of admission.



PARENTS/GUARDIAN MUST ACCOMPANY HIS/HER WARD AT THE TIME OF ADMISSION.

All admissions of the college are provisional and subject to the approval of P.U. Chd. The college will not be responsible in case the admission of any student is not approved by the university due to any reason. The admission to B.A., B.Com., B.C.A. B.Sc (FD), B.Voc (HAM), B.Voc (FPQM) & P.G. courses (3rd and 5th Sem) is provisional. The students who fail to pass 50% subject/papers will not be eligible for the next semester. Their provisional admission will automatically stand cancelled.

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

Ist Semester

Eligibility:

Admission to B.A. Part I shall be open to a person who has passed: 10+2 examination of PSEB Mohali, CBSE Delhi, ICSE Delhi or any other examination recognised by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent thereto

Subjects Offered (Compulsory Subjects):

- English Compulsory
- Punjabi Compulsory
- Environment Education & Road Safety (IInd Sem.)

Elective Subject:

A student is required to take up three subjects in all, selecting not more than one subject from any of the following set of combinations.

- Languages (Énglish, Punjabi & Hindi)
- Economics, Fine Arts

- History, Maths Home Science Political Science
- **Physical Education**
- Computer Science
- (VIII) Music Vocal

Subject to the following conditions:

- Only one language out of the three can be opted. Maths can not be opted with History.
- A student cannot opt for more than two practical subjects.
- Only those students can opt Maths in B.A. who have passed the same subject in +2
- Economics cannot be opted with Fine Arts.
- Pol. Sci. cannot be opted with Music (vocal).

Bachelor of Arts B.A. IIIrd Sem.

Appeared in B.A. (Ist, IInd Sem) & eligibility as per Uni. Rules. Subject can be changed but students have to clear the deficient subject.

B.A. Vth Sem.

Eligibility: as per Panjab University, Chandigarh norms.

Bachelor of Computer Applications (B.C.A.) **₹** Ist Semester

Eligibility: Admission to B.C.A. Ist Sem. shall be open to a person who has passed:

- 10+2 examination in any discipline with 50% marks.
- The candidate must have passed Mathematics upto Matric level.
- Admission to B.C.A. | will be made strictly on merit, Reservation will be followed as per P.U. CHD, & Puniab Govt, rules.

B.C.A. IIIrd / Vth Sem.

Eligibility: as per Panjab University, Chandigarh norms.

Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) Fashion Designing ■ Ist Semester

Eligibility: 10+2 in any stream with 50% marks / 45% marks for SC, BC students.

Ist Semester

Eligibility:

- (A) Admission to the first year of B.Com (General) degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognised Board/Council/Uni.
- (a) +2 examination with three of the following subjects securing at least 45% marks in the aggregate:
 - Commerce, Accountancy, Economics, Mathematics, Banking and Trade, Commercial, Geography, Office Management & Secretarial Practice (Office Organisation and Mgt.) Mercantile Law (or any Company Law) Auditing, Type Writing and stenography/ Computer (for typewriting).
- +2 examination of B.A. Part I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University, Chandigarh with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate.
- +2 examination of B.A. Part I / Pre-Engineering / Pre-Medical Examination of the P.U. CHD. under the old scheme not covered in clause (a) and (b) securing at least 50% marks.
- Any other examination recognized by the university as e q u i v a I e n t to (a) or (b) or (c) as given under each clause. Provided that candidate seeking admission to the first year of B.Com should have passed in the subject of English in the +2 examination.
- (B) Subject to the reservations made by the P.U. CHD. the admission shall be on merit.

POST GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMMES

Master of Arts (M.A) (Semester System)

The Duration of the course Master of Arts shall be two years, consisting of four semester. The college offers M.A. Courses in the following subject:

1. English 2. Punjabi 3. Hindi 4. History 5. Economics

Eligibility: A person who has passed one of the following examinations from the Panjab University, Chandigarh or from any other university whose examination has been recognized as equivalent to the corresponding examination of this university will be eligible to join the first semester of M.A. course.

A. B.A. with honours in the subject of Post Graduate course. B. Bachelor's Degree in any faculty with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

C. BA (pass) obtaining at least 45% marks in the subject of post graduation course. D. Master's Degree examination in another subject or another faculty.

Master of Commerce (M.Com) (Semester System)

Eliaibility

- 1. A Bachelor's degree in Commerce in General or Professional or Business Administration with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate, or
- 2. B.Com Hons. Degree with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate. or
- 3. A Graduate with honours in Economics / Mathematics / Commerce / Statistics with not less than 45% marks in aggregate.
- 4. A Graduate with 50% marks in the aggregate having offered either Economics, Mathematics, Statistics or Commerce as a subject in the examination.
- 5. Any other qualification recognised by the UGC for this purpose.

M.Sc.IT (Semester System)

Eligibility

- 1. Candidate must have 3 years degree in B.C.A. / B.Sc. (IT) B.Tech./B.E. (Computer Science / information Technology) from Panjab University, Chandigarh or any other University recognized by UGC.
- 2. B.A. pass students with Math & Computer Science.

Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (PGDCA)

Eliaibility

Graduation in any stream with 50% marks in aggregate.

UGC ADD-ON COURSES

- 1. Fashion Designing 2. Cosmetology 3. Computer Based Accounting
- 4. Communicative English 5. Interior Decoration (IDT)

The college is running a chain of skill- oriented & value added courses approved by UGC at the Under Graduate level. These courses will be taken up by the students in parallel while doing the degree course. These are Certificate, Diploma & Advanced Diploma courses, Successful completion of one year course would entitle the student to a certificate, a two year course would entitle her to a diploma; & a three year course to an Advanced Diploma.

Add on courses can be taken up To Be Noted during graduation & not after passing out.

DEAR PARENTS PLEASE NOTE!

- * Parents must accompany their wards at the time of admission.
- Parents are advised to go through the fee structure properly before getting their wards admitted to the college.
- A student will be punished, rusticated or even expelled from the college if she directly or indirectly takes part or induces others to do so in any movement, agitation or unlawful activities in the college for any reason whatsoever, which in the opinion of the Principal is subversive of the college discipline.
- It is compulsory for parents to attend Parent-Teacher Meetings Which is conducted after house examination.
- In case of students, who have earned compartment in previous exam, the college will not be responsible for sending their examination forms, enquiring Uni. results of the compartment subject / examination.

All decisions are notified on the notice board/ online groups of the college. The college is not expected to send letters to the students individually in case they are absent for long time on any pretext either medical or otherwise.







CHANGE OF SUBJECT

Students are advised to select subjects only after due consideration so that change is made only if necessary. Students are permitted to change subject within 15days from the commencement of the session on payment of Rs. 50/- only. But permission of change should not disturb the time table. The Principal can exercise her discretion regarding change of subject.

LECTURES IN THE SUBJECT GIVEN UP WILL NOT BE COUNTED FOR THE SUBJECT TAKEN UP.

Compartment Candidates

A candidate who is placed under compartment in any subject in B.A. / B.Com/BCA semester examination of the university shall be allowed to join M.A. I class provisionally. If she fulfills the other requirements.

The Subject in which she has re-appear is not offered in Post Graduate Course.

If she fails to clear the compartment, her provisional admission to M.A. I will stand cancelled.

MIGRATION RULES

- A) No migration will be permitted if the combination of subjects offered by the student does not tally with the combination of subjects allowed in this college.
- B) Candidates from other colleges of Punjab University can migrate by seeking prior permission of the Principals and the university after obtaining a discharge certificate from the previous college.
- C) No migration to the college shall be allowed unless student seeking migration brings with her the college leaving certificate stating payment of college dues, lectures, delivered / attended in the previous college.
- D) Local migration of students shall be allowed only for valid reasons.
- E) Migration Certificate should be submitted at the time of admission.

WITHDRAWAL OF NAME

An application for withdrawal of name must be made by parents / guardian otherwise the student is liable to pay all college dues incurred by her for not having her name withdrawn.

CHARACTER CERTIFICATE

Students must get their character certificate within two months after declaration of the result. After this period the character certificate will be issued in cash payment of Rs. 200/-













The dates for payment of fee dues will be fixed and notified by the Principal. The fee for the May to October must be deposited in the Bank (Oriental Bank of Commerce, D.M. College Branch, Moga) at the time of admission. The fee from November to April must be deposited in the month of November at the bank. Fee slips will be issued to the student from the office.

FINE

Fine for Lecture shortage, absence from class for the whole day, absence during house examinations and payment of fee after due date will be charged from the students as per Panjab University guidelines.

PLEASE REMEMBER

- Fee once paid shall not be refunded.
- In case of change of subjects from Home Sci., Music, Phy. Education, Computer Science and Fine Arts, the fee as charged earlier for the practical subject shall not be refunded.
- Fee Structure of the college will be approved by the University later. The approved fee and funds will have to paid by the students. Extra fee will be charged from students for A.C. Classrooms.

LIBRARY RULES


Clearance certificate must be obtained at the end of semester.













IDENTITY CARD

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION

Under the University regulations every student in order to be eligible for appearing in the various University Examinations.

- A) Must attend at least 75% of the full course of lectures delivered in each subject.
- B) must obtain at least 25% marks in aggregate of all the subjects in House Examination.

Every student must assure her respective class teacher/controller House Examinations that she has fulfilled these conditions. In case she fails to fulfill the conditions she will be detained and have to appear privately.

LEAVE RULES

- A) Leave must be applied to the Principal duly counter signed by Parents / Guardian of the student.
- B) Leave for more than 7 days should be submitted to the Principal personally by the parents/guardian.
- C) Leave sought on ground of illness for more than 7 days must be certified by a competent medical authority.
- D) The name of the concerned teacher and the subjects of the student must be written in the application, otherwise the application will not be considered.
- E) Absentee from morning assembly, college function, group meeting & tutorial meeting will be fined Rs. 10/- only
- F) Absentee fine without leave is Rs. 5 for a day and Rs. 1 for a period.
- G) The maximum leave allowed to a student during the session is 15 days only, Extra leave shall automatically be cancelled as absence.
- H) On days when special functions are held, leave will be granted only by the Principal.


